A Visual Guide to Your School Field Trip to the High Museum of Art

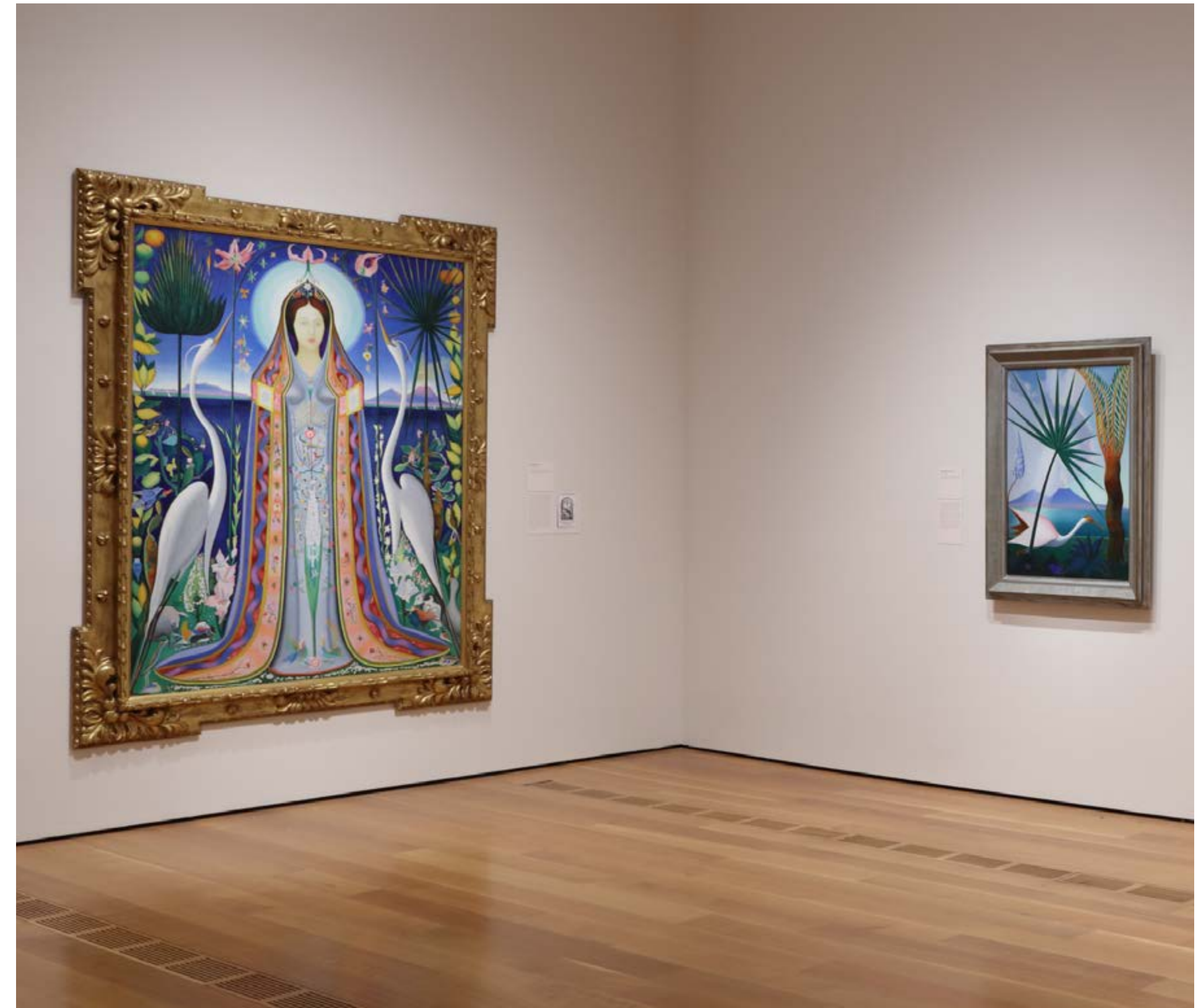


A museum is a place of learning and excitement!

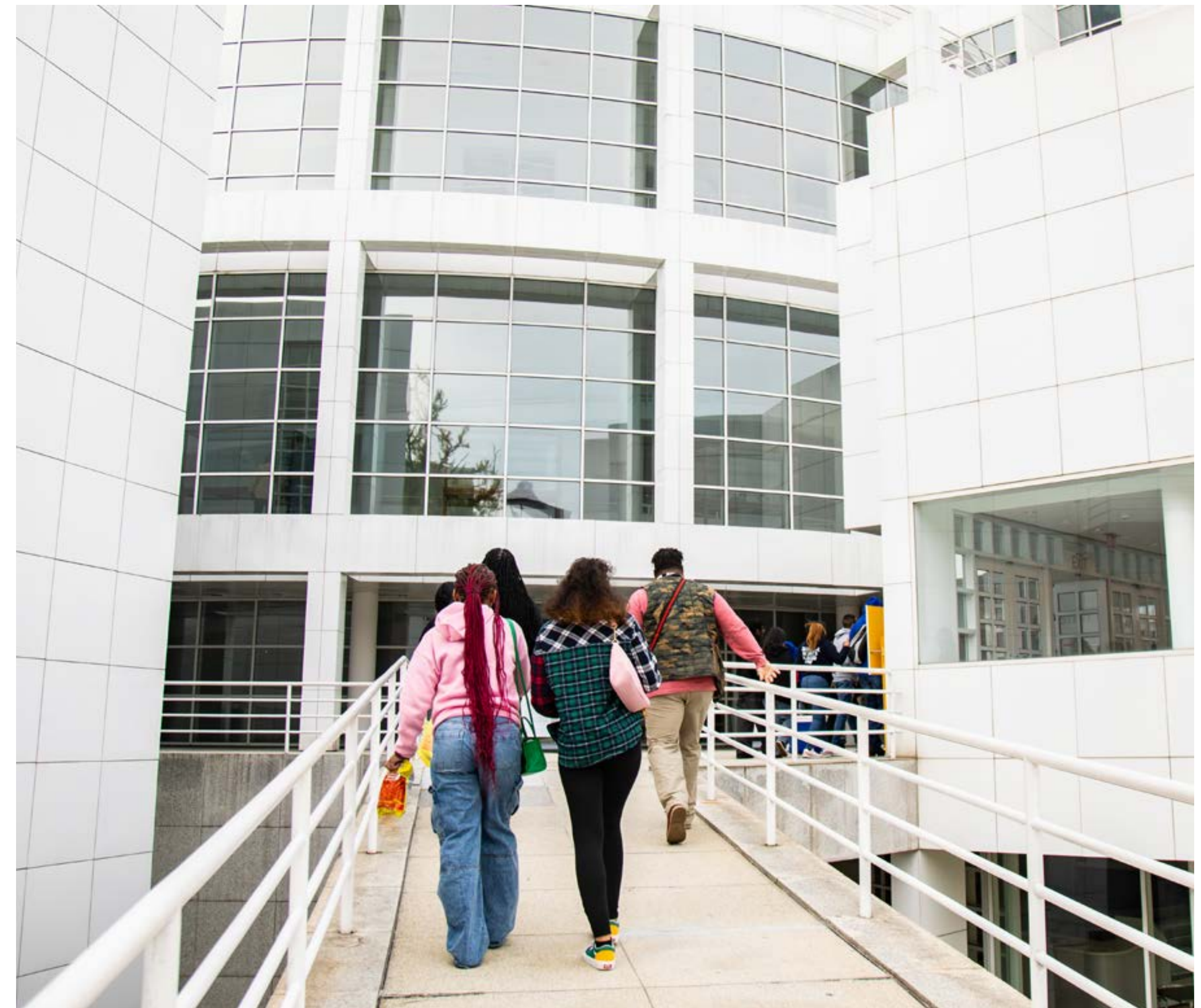
At the High Museum of Art, we collect, preserve, and exhibit works of art to share with visitors like you.



The High Museum of Art has a collection of more than 19,000 works of art from around the world. About a thousand of them are currently on view.



We also borrow art from museums and collections all over the world for our temporary special exhibitions.



Here's what to expect when you arrive:

Your bus will let your group off on Peachtree Street, N.E. You will go up the ramp on this street, which will lead you to our entrance for school groups, which is different from the museum's main entrance.



Staff members will greet your group at the door and will collect your lunches, bags, and coats to store safely while you enjoy your time at the museum.



When you enter, it's good to keep in mind that bathrooms are not located on every floor of the museum. There are bathrooms near the Robinson Atrium, where you will enter the museum, and on one floor below in the Education Center, where student art-making workshops are held.

Docent-Guided Tours:

- A docent is a volunteer who learns about the art in the museum and leads guided tours of the galleries.
- Your docent will use the artworks to teach you new things.
- Docents love to hear what you think about art and are excited to hear your questions and ideas.



There are a few things to keep in mind during your visit:

- **Only take photographs if you have permission to do so. Make sure the flash is turned off!**
- **Always stand at least two feet away from the art and remember not to touch.**
- **Stay with your group and be sure to walk, not run.**



Workshops:

- If your class is participating in a workshop during your visit, you'll get to meet one of our teaching artists.
- Teaching artists love to work with students. They will lead you in a lesson to create a work of art inspired by what you have seen in the museum.



While you're here, be sure to...

- Look closely.
- Ask questions.
- Have fun!
